

STALKING OR SEXUAL ASSAULT PROTECTIVE ORDER PACKET

A request for a protective order is a *civil* matter, not a *criminal* matter. You need to report the incident to the police to have it prosecuted criminally.

What is stalking?	Person A commits the crime of stalking when Person A contacts Person B without Person B's permission MORE THAN ONE TIME, and this creates a reasonable fear of physical injury or death to Person B or Person B's family member. For a more complete definition, see Alaska Statute 11.41.270 on page 5 of the instructions.
What is sexual assault?	Sexual assault is a crime of "sexual contact" or "sexual penetration" done without the adult victim's knowledge or consent, or done by an older person to a minor. For a more complete definition of these crimes, see Alaska Statute 11.41.410 through 11.41.450, or look on page 6 of the instructions.
Is this the right packet for you?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use this packet if the person you need protection from is a friend, student at your school, neighbor, co-worker, landlord, tenant, or someone you do not know. • Use the domestic violence petition instead if the person who stalked or sexually assaulted you is someone you have a household relationship with. See Alaska Statute 18.66.990 for a list of qualifying domestic violence household relationships.
