arisi illne	avely disabled " means a condition in which a person as a result of mental illness (A) is in danger of physical having from such complete neglect of basic needs for food, clothing, shelter, or personal safety as to render serious accidents, or death highly probable if care by another is not taken; or (B) is so incapacitated that the person is incapable <i>i</i> ving safely in freedom. AS 47.30.915.

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3. Commitment in a treatment facility is appropriate. "Least restrictive alternative" means mental health treatment facilities and conditions of treatment that (A) are no more harsh, hazardous, or intrusive than necessary to achieve the treatment objectives of the patient; and (B) involve no restrictions on physical movement nor supervised residence or inpatient care except as reasonably necessary for the administration of treatment or the protection of the patient or others from physical injury. AS 47.30.915.
