This written notice must be delivered or postmarked by the tenth day, and I must keep a copy of that notice of withdrawal and record the date it was delivered or postmarked.

After 10 days, I can ask the court to withdraw (cancel) this consent, which the court may or may not grant. The court must find that withdrawal is in the best interests of the child after both the petitioner and I are given a chance to be heard.

b. For an Indian Child (unmarried minor child only):

At any time before the adoption decree is signed, I can withdraw (cancel) this consent by writing to the court at the address in paragraph 10 or to the person or agency that asked me to fill out this consent form. This written notice must be delivered or postmarked by the last day of this time period, and I must keep a copy of that notice and record the date it was delivered or postmarked.
