At the hearing, the court will decide whether the minor needs a guardian, and if so, who the guardian should be. You do not have to attend the hearing, but you may attend it if you wish.

This is a confidential matter, so you should not reveal information from this notice or the attached petition to others who are not involved in the case.<sup>2</sup>

NOTICE TO PARENTS AND INDIAN CUSTODIANS:<sup>3</sup> You have the right to be represented by an attorney in this proceeding and can get a court-appointed attorney if you cannot afford to hire one on your own. File *Request for Appointed Attorney* (form P-910) to ask for a court-appointed attorney. The form is available in paper copy from the court clerk, or online at <u>http://www.courts.alaska.gov/forms/index.htm</u>. You have the right to receive at least ten (10) days' notice of the hearing and, if you request, may be granted up to 20 additional days to prepare for the hearing. Indian custodians have the right to intervene (participate) in the case.

NOTICE TO TRIBE: An Indian child's tribe has the right to intervene, to be represented by an attorney, to receive at least ten (10) days' notice of the hearing and, upon request, may be granted up to 20 additional days to prepare for the hearing. The tribe (or a parent or Indian custodian) may also petition the court to transfer the case to tribal court.

<u>Note</u>: If both of the minor's parents sign a consent and request (in writing) that the tribe not be notified, then notice to the tribe may be waived.<sup>4</sup> The parents may use form <u>PG-616</u> to do this.
