Our mission is to provide accessible and comprehensive legal information resources and services for all Alaskans.

What can you find at the law library?

- 50 State laws and cases accessible by books or computer
- Federal laws and cases accessible by books or computer
- Electronic databases for legal research at no charge
- Hardcopy books and eBooks on a wide variety of legal topics
- Law reviews
- Web site with links to legal research sites
- Photocopying and interlibrary loan services

Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau and Ketchikan have the largest collections of print materials.

All libraries have computers with access to WestlawNext, HeinOnline, CCH Tax Research Network, eBooks, and other internet based legal resources.

How can library staff help?

Library staff members are available to assist you in Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau and Ketchikan. You may also call 1-888-282-2082 for assistance.

Library Staff can

- Explain how to use legal research tools
- Help you locate a particular statute or case when you have a reference or citation
- Direct you to sources of law, including statutes and cases
- Direct you to forms
- Recommend resources to begin your research
- Refer you to agencies

Library staff cannot

- Give legal advice
- Interpret the meaning of statutes, cases or regulations
- Select statutes, cases, forms, or regulations for your situation
- Tell you how to file a document, what document to file, or how to proceed with court actions
- State opinions on legal matters
- Do legal research for you
