ORDER NO. 282

Amending Civil Rule 4(h)  
by allowing service by  
certified mail for all  
civil process.

IT IS ORDERED:

Paragraph (h) of Rule 4, Rules of Civil Procedure, is  
amended to read:

(h) Service of Process by Mail. In addition to  
other methods of service provided for by this  
rule, process may also be served within this state  
or the United States or any of its possessions by  
registered or certified mail upon an individual  
other than an infant or an incompetent person and  
upon a corporation, partnership, and unincorporated  
association. In such case, copies of the summons  
and complaint or other process shall be mailed by  
the clerk for restricted delivery only to the party  
to whom the summons or other process is directed or to  
the person authorized under federal regulation to  
receive his restricted delivery mail. All receipts  
shall be so addressed that they are returned to the  
party requesting the summons or process or his attorney.  
Proof of service shall be made by affidavit forthwith.
